How are we funded?

The money that the council spends comes from the rates that are paid by the residents (approx £68 per household) who live in the community and this is shown on the Wealden rates demand bill.

This sum of money, called the '**precept**', is used by the Westham and Stone Cross Community Council to improve facilities and services for local people. Westham and Stone Cross Community Council recommended that the precept for the precept for 2011/12 remains at £127,966 (no increase) and it will fund maintenance, general administration costs, rates, grants, insurances and footpaths. CHAIRS REPORT

THE NEW COMMUNITY SHELTER IN ADUR PARK



Have you walked through Adur Park?

You can't help notice the new Community Shelter for the use of all our residents young and old,

At the full council meeting in June it was agreed by 9 votes to fit a Community Shelter in Adur Park. The shelter was subsequently ordered from Yorkshire and just like a jigsaw puzzle the shelter was erected in 4 hours that include painting. What a feat of engineering.

Everyone that walked through the park, teens, dog walkers, mothers and children were intrigued by the work that was going on. Finally the shelter was visible in its finished form and quickly a group of young footballers could be seen enjoying their drinks in the shelter.

At the May full Council meeting the following items were resolved

- To renew the license to Pevensey and Westham Football Club for the year 2011-2012.
- To renew the grazing license to Mr Hanscombe for the year 2011-2012.

At the June full Council meeting the following items were resolved

- By 9 votes to 2 that the grit bins stay.
- By 7 votes to 6 to supply and fit an additional bin at Medina Drive but rejected the proposal to have a bin at Windmill Green.
- By 12 votes to 1 that the bins are filled a maximum of two times each financial year.
- To extend the entrance to Adur Park by 6' to allow a vehicle and trailer off road before opening the gate.
- To fit a lifebelt on the middle corner of Westham Pond and to monitor banks for future re-enforcement.

At the June Full Council meeting it was agreed to discontinue working parties and refer all matters to the appropriate standing committees so that residents could participate (as non-voting members)

Why

- working parties can only make suggestions and recommendations which then have to be referred to the Full council for further discussion and resolution
- This system to date has taken far too long to resolve issues.

Standing Committees can:

- agree expenditure up to a certain amount
- suspend the meeting at the appropriate point so that members of the public can express ideas and opinions and help progress the item
- seek costings or further advice
- make recommendations that can then be passed onto the full council

The Community Council hope that this new method of working can involve members of the public in discussions and aid decision making.

The Council Committee Structures (a reminder)

Westham and Stone Cross Community Council has three standing committees as agreed at the AGM in May

- Finance and General Purposes
- Parks and Open Spaces
- Planning

Members of the public can be invited to speak at committee meetings (but have no voting rights)

At the July full Council meeting the following items were resolved

- To accept the Emergency Plan Amendment and pay Wealden up to £300 to keep the Emergency Telephone Network running.
- To accept the Business Plan updates recommended by the Finance and General Purposes Committee at its meeting on 11th July 2011.
- Zurich will carry out this year's park's inspections but will review the situation next year.

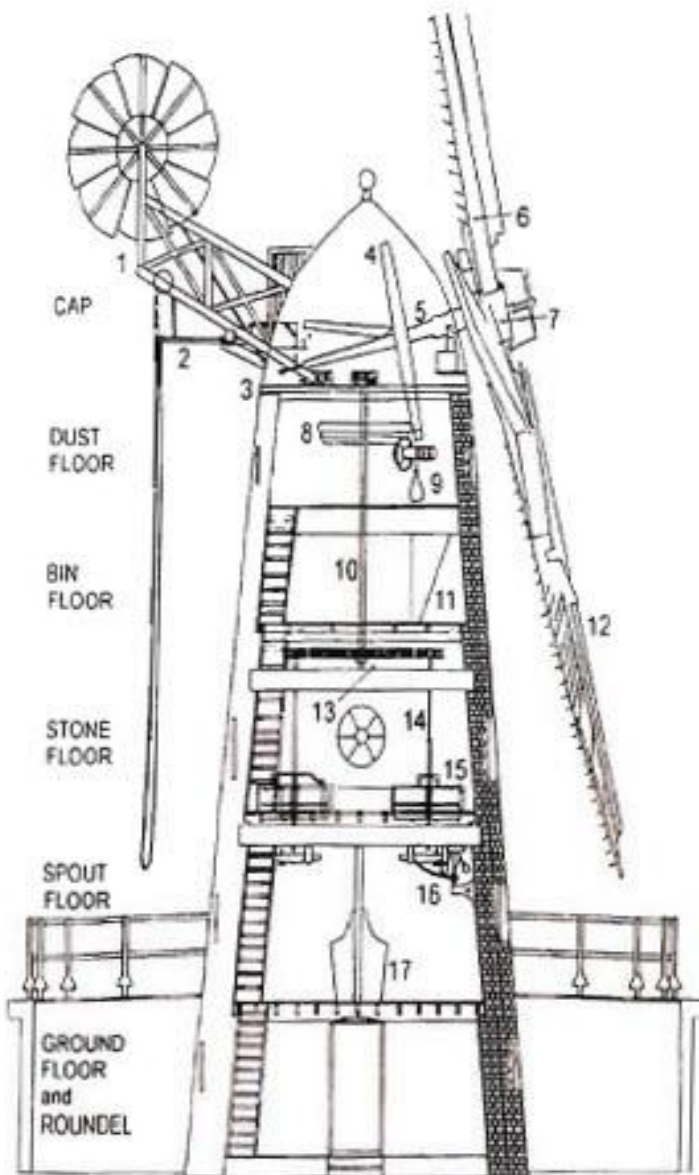
At Hobney Rise there is a piece of open ground belonging to the Council.

We know that many people, particularly those of you who can see Stone Cross Windmill from their properties are upset and possibly worried about the state of the Mill at the moment.

The Cap and Fanstage had to be removed from the tower; the main concern being the extremely urgent repairs needed, a job which had been pending for at least 18 months whilst the Trust saved enough money to contemplate undertaking the work. Had the work been put off any longer, the safety of the Mill and the surrounding properties would have been put at risk.

The removal of the sweeps, stocks, cap and Fanstage entailed a great deal of effort. It involved all the Trustees on both the Maintenance and the administration side of the Trust and substantial help of Coussens, the crane firm.

It is amazing that many local people still do not realise that the Mill is a fully working one, with its original machinery and grinds Sussex grown organic wheat into flour on a regular basis.

Once the Cap and Fanstage is replaced onto the tower it will again be grinding wheat. When open to the public the Mill also serves refreshments in the Mill Store, organises cream teas for groups and volunteers, travel around Sussex giving talks to various groups.

Everyone involved with the Trust is a volunteer and give up their time to help preserve this wonderful part of our Heritage.

Stone Cross Mill

The Mill Trust is a very small and poor one which does not receive automatic continuous support from any official bodies. Westham and Stone Cross Community Council have been very good in supporting the Mill but this is not a right; a grant has to be applied for each year.

A lot of time and effort is made by Trust volunteers in trying to obtain grants for the Mill, the Mill Store and grounds. It is the aim of the Trust to ensure that the Mill and the grounds are available to the community; not just for the present but for future generations. The Mill is part of the industrial heritage of the area and as such needs the active support of the local population.

Friends of the Windmill

You can help to preserve this part of our heritage by becoming a Friend of the Windmill. A newsletter is produced every three months which will keep you up to date on what projects are in hand and how they are coming along. It will also give you notice of any forthcoming fund-raising events.

Fund-raising is a vital part of the work carried out by volunteers. Although the Windmill has been restored, maintenance is an ever increasing, on-going expense, if the Mill is to be kept in reasonable condition. To this end, fund-raising events are held throughout the year in order to keep the Mill open to the public.

Volunteers are always required to assist the organisers and if you feel that you can help sometimes, please do get in touch with one of the Trustees. If, of course, you have ideas for unusual fund-raising events, the organisers are always happy to listen.

The Mill is manned and maintained solely by willing volunteers who give their "spare" time freely to become actively involved. So, if you feel you can spare a little time: whether you are practical and wish to assist with the maintenance; would like to steward (training is given); help in the Mill Store, or all three, you will be made very welcome

On Saturday October 8 the Stone Cross Mill Trustees are organising a coffee morning at Westham Village Hall from 10-12.

Do come along and help support the Mill – there will be a variety of stalls selling a range of goods including homemade cakes, books and bric-a-brac

Entry is 50p and includes tea or coffee

If you have become a victim of a scam or fraud, remember that you have not been targeted personally. Scam letters, e-mails, telephone calls and faxes are sent out in their thousands daily to individuals and companies worldwide.

What is Action Fraud?

Action Fraud is the UK's national fraud reporting centre and the place for you to report fraud and scams, or to get advice if you're not sure what to do.

Action Fraud is available 24 hours a day - members of the public can complete a fraud report at **Action Fraud online** and gain practical advice on fraud prevention. For those without online access Action Fraud advisers are available by phoning the reporting line: **0300 123 2040**.

If you've been a victim of fraud, you can report it to **Action Fraud online** using the secure online fraud reporting tool. You'll be given a crime reference number and your case will be referred on to the police force that investigates fraud.

The Police Panel

The purpose of the police panel meeting is for residents to set priorities, discuss problems or issues which can then be passed onto the police or any of the other relevant agencies.

Panel meetings are held at least twice a year

The panel should be run by the public not the police and ANY resident can come along as the meetings are not solely for councillors or police representatives

Follow ups are posted on the Sussex Police Web Site and passed onto relevant agencies

3. Choosing each month how often you are on duty – a regular, or an occasional commitment, which allows for holidays, family visits and other appointments.
4. Helping with experience in business management and company secretary duties which would also be welcome on the Committee.
